How the money you raise will help people to make the most of their lives.

We receive 56% of our funding from generous supporters just like you. However much you are able to raise, you're making a difference to the people who need it the most.

£5

will pay for a day in Day Services including Complementary Therapies.

FUNDRAISING MADE EASY

You've got the power to change lives, so the least we can do is give you some tips!

FIND THE IDEAL EVENT SPACE

Think carefully about the sort of space you'll need. Indoor or outdoor? Big or small? What facilities do you need? And don't forget to tell the venue it's for charity – you may get a reduced rate for the space.

SPREAD THE WORD

Tell people why you're doing your event. Your personal reasons will really help motivate your supporters. Facebook and Twitter are ideal for inviting and updating people. If possible, write a blog about your progress. It doesn't have to be a masterpiece; it just keeps your supporters involved.

STAY SAFE

When holding a large or public event it is recommended that you:

- Contact your local council for any necessary permissions, licensing, trading standards, and health and safety issues.
- Think about First Aid and fire safety.
- To make sure the event is safe for everyone concerned consult the Health and Safety Executive and check the 'Five steps to a risk assessment' before hosting any event.

TIME IS OF THE ESSESSENCE

Before you set the date, make sure you've given yourself plenty of time to get everything organised and for people to get it in their diaries. Pick a date that's easy for people, like the weekend – or a Friday, if you're doing something at work.

SET YOUR TARGET

Once you've set your fundraising goal, tell everyone! Seeing how you're progressing helps inspire people to give generously.

BUDGETS

Make sure you cover the costs of your event, and it doesn't leave you with a deficit. If you need equipment, see if you can borrow it rather than buying things. You can also cut costs by asking local businesses to donate prizes.

Marathon – Would you like to challenge yourself? Why not run a half or full marathon in aid of Willow Burn Hospice? 



PROMOTION

Promoting your event or activity helps you raise more money and awareness for Willow Burn. You can do this through your local press, social media, local posters/flyers and word of mouth.

Local media

If you are holding an event, your local newspaper or radio station might be interested in coming along or sending a photographer. If you are undertaking a personal challenge, it could make an interesting article.

Contacting local media may seem a bit daunting but it is relatively easy. All it takes is a little forward planning. Local press will be interested in stories with a local link and a good human interest angle. You should be able to find email addresses and phone numbers on their website. The 'Contact us' page is the best place to start. You could also contact

<u>aenglish@willowburnhospice.org.uk</u> and we can point you in the right direction or help you write your article. If you do contact the press or get any coverage, please let us know, we are also happy to provide quotes about your fundraising.

Posters and Flyers

Make up posters advertising your event and ask to put them up in your workplace or school. We are happy to provide you with posters if you need them and please do ask for our logo and charity number if you are making your own. Ask local businesses if they would mind if you put a flyer or poster for your event in their window. In the cases of large public events ask to leave flyers on the counter or at tables for people to pick up.

Any publicity material must state that the event is being held 'In aid of Willow Burn Hospice' and have the Registered Charity Number on 519659. We can even supply you with an 'in aid of' logo

Online fundraising

Online fundraising pages and social media are a great way to publicise your fundraising.



Each day it costs £2,400 to run the Helen McArdle Wing for 24 hours and £575 to run day care in the Sir Tom Cowie Wing. Memory Lane

Memory Lane is a peaceful and scenic pathway located at the bottom of the Willow Burn Gardens. Within the path are dedicated bricks which can be engraved to remember someone special to you. This is a really special place where you will find a lot of space and peace to reflect on your memories. KEEPING IT LEGAL



Charity fundraising is regulated by law, and after all of your hard work, we want to help you make sure your event is a success. Here are a few key tips but if you have any questions or would like advice on the Fundraising Regulator, please contact: aenglish@willowburnhospice.org.uk

Licences

You may require a license for:

- alcohol or entertainment, including recorded music
- holding a raffle, lottery or auction
- doing a public money collection
- putting up banners or signs in public areas.

You will need to check with your local council for further information.

Public collections

Collecting money in a public place of any kind requires permission from your local council:

If you're fundraising on private property, make sure to ask the owner's permission first.

Insurance

If your event involves the public, you will need to have Public Liability Insurance. Please check what public liability insurance the venue has in place before your event. Unfortunately, Willow Burn cannot accept liability for a fundraising activity or event you undertake in support of us.

Money

Advice for handling and counting money at fundraising events:

- where possible have two people present
- when money is being counted collect cash using a secure container e.g. a sealed container for a collection or a secure cash box for change
- bank the money collected as soon as possible.

Food

Contact the Food Standards Agency (www.food.gov.uk) for guidelines about food hygiene.

Raffles and lotteries

The most straightforward way to host a raffle is to make sure:

- all tickets cost the same amount
- sale and draw of tickets happens on the same day/night – you'll need a licence from your local council if tickets are sold in advance.
- If you plan to run your lottery over a longer period of time or sell tickets at more than one venue, you will need to purchase a local lottery license from your council. For advice on raffles and lotteries, please visit:

Whatever you raise, Gift Aid it!

Gift Aid makes donations to registered charities worth more by allowing them to claim 25p from the government for every £1 donated, substantially boosting your fundraising total. Gift Aid can be applied to any donation from a UK taxpayer, as long as the amount claimed is no more than the tax paid that financial year. If donating online, please tick to option for Gift Aid or if you are donating via bank transfer, cheque or cash, please ask us for a Gift Aid form.
